



BrainPOP & BrainPOP Jr. Great Ideas



ENERGIZE YOUR LESSON

BrainPOP and BrainPOP Jr. are great ways to introduce a new topic or concept. Use the movies to engage your students with active viewing! Pause when a new vocabulary word pops up, or to have students paraphrase what happened, make a prediction or connect what they just saw to their own experiences.

ASSESS WITH FINESSE

Give a BrainPOP Quiz before a movie to gauge students' familiarity with a topic. Or, take the quiz with the whole class afterward to verify what everyone learned. Choose one of three quiz options: graded online, reviewable online or printable.

HANDS ON, HANDS UP

Students love hands-on learning and exploring on their own. After they've watched a BrainPOP movie, have individual students

research experiments with Bob the Ex-Lab Rat or explore Related Topics. You can also encourage independent reading with the new FYI feature. On BrainPOP Jr., bookmark the interactive games or the Write About It, Draw About It or Word Wall features so students can investigate at the computer center or lab.

DESTRESS TEST PREP

Many teachers use BrainPOP and BrainPOP Jr. to review and reinforce concepts, especially before an exam. Movies and quizzes are correlated to state standards and help reduce the stress that often accompanies standardized test preparation. Spice up your exam prep by incorporating BrainPOP into your lessons!

CHECK, ONE, TWO

Practice public speaking skills by inviting students to introduce a movie to the rest of the class. Let them navigate and choose when to pause the movie for discussion or questions. Your students will love running the show!

TAKE NOTE OF THIS

If your students are working on note-taking skills, BrainPOP and BrainPOP Jr. can help. Encourage students to put the movie's main concepts into their own words or summarize the main ideas. Use our closed-captioning feature to support struggling readers and writers. Pause often and give them plenty of time to write.

IT'S A SIGN

Teach students the American Sign Language letters for A, B, C and D, then have them raise their hands with the sign for the answer they choose during quizzes. One student can tally the votes and click on the most popular choice.

"COME ON DOWN!"


Keep your students engaged and enthusiastic! Ask them BrainPOP and BrainPOP Jr. quiz questions the way you'd hear them on your favorite game show.
