Body Paragraph #1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • excellent hunter • superior vision & hearing • eats meat • catches prey alive • hunts during day • don't flock--prefers to be alone • builds nest high, remote 	Animal Behavior	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • excellent hunter • superior vision & hearing • eats meat • catch prey alive • hunts at night • don't flock--prefers to be alone • builds nest in tree or building
Body Paragraph #2	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • razor-sharp talons to get prey • sharp beak that is longer & heavier than owl's • stiff & smooth feathers • small eyes • eyes can move 	Physical Features	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • razor-sharp talons to get prey • sharp beak • soft & fluffy feathers • large eyes • big head • eyes can't move, but neck is more flexible
Body Paragraph #3	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • flies high in sky • soars gracefully • doesn't always flap (often floats) 	Movement	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • doesn't fly high or far • rarely soars • can swoop after prey
Body Paragraph #4	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • represents strength & freedom • national bird of U.S. • symbol used in military and other countries, too 	Symbol	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • represents wisdom • used as character in children's books to give advice/solve problems
