STEP 1: KNOW THE TOPIC

Writers must possess a lot of knowledge and information about the topic in order to develop it and present it in an organized product.

STEP 2: **CAPTURE EVERY DETAIL**Information can't be organized if it isn't identified. All/Most working details must be noted in order to begin the process.

STEP 3: **SORT RELATED INFORMATION**Multiple details are physically sorted or grouped together based on similar information.

STEP 4: **LABEL THE SORTED GROUPINGS**Details are "related" when they all have something in common. That commonality is the label that holds them all together.
