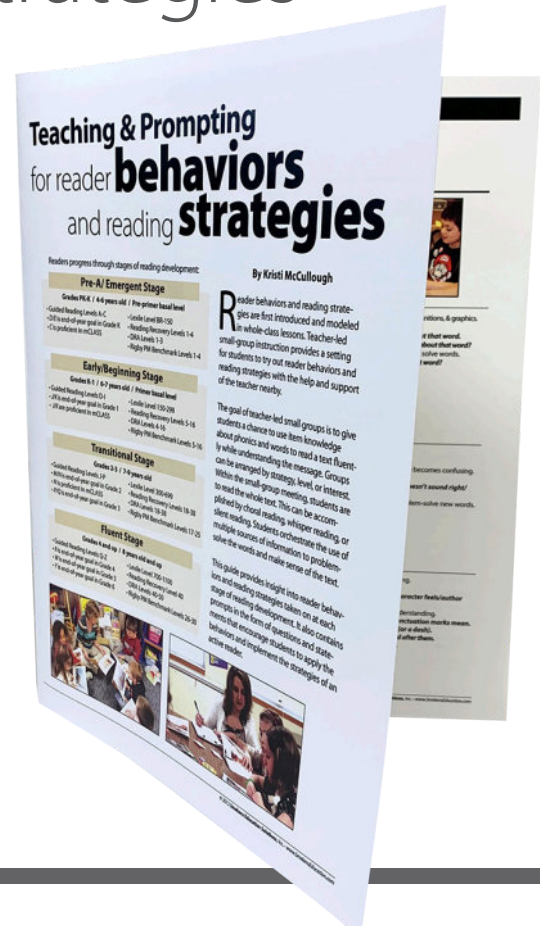

This guide provides insight into reader behaviors and reading strategies to help teachers meet their goals for supporting their students in small-group guided reading.

Each strategy includes skills with prompts and questions for each developmental stage of reading (Pre-A/ Emergent, Early/ Beginning, Transitional, and Fluent).

Graduate-Level Credit

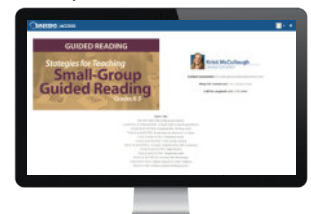
